





One-Month Internship Training Program on Organ Donation Law and Living Will Awareness For Law and Medical Students

Objective

To equip law and medical students with a comprehensive understanding of organ donation laws and living will guidelines, and to engage them in awareness campaigns aimed at law and medical schools and society at large.

Program Structure

Week 1: Orientation and Legal Framework

Objective: Familiarize students with the legal and ethical aspects of organ donation and living wills.

- 1. Day 1: Introduction to the Program
 - o Ice-breaking session and introduction to the program's objectives.
 - o Overview of organ donation law and living will directives in India.
- 2. Day 2-3: Legal Framework
 - Detailed sessions on the Transplantation of Human Organs and Tissues Act (THOTA), 1994.
 - o Supreme Court of India's judgment on living wills (Common Cause v. Union of India).
- 3. Day 4: Ethical and Medical Perspectives
 - O Discussions on ethical dilemmas and medical protocols in organ donation.
- 4. Day 5: Case Studies and Group Discussions
 - o Analysis of landmark cases and hypothetical scenarios.

Activity:

• Mock debate on balancing legal, ethical, and medical aspects of organ donation.

Week 2: Skills Development and Drafting

Objective: Train students on drafting legal documents and conducting research.

- 1. Day 1-2: Drafting Skills
 - o Training on drafting living wills, consent forms, and legal agreements related to organ donation.
- 2. Day 3-4: Research Methodology
 - o Guidance on researching laws and medical procedures.
- 3. Day 5: Presentation Skills
 - o Tips for presenting findings and conducting public awareness sessions.

Activity:

• Draft living wills and simulate a legal consultation on organ donation laws.









Week 3: Community Engagement and Awareness Campaigns

1. Day 1-2: Workshop Preparation

o Plan and prepare workshops for medical and law schools.

2. Day 3-4: Awareness Drives

3. Day 5: Feedback and Reflection

Activity:
